#### When are applications due?

Completed applications (application form, essay, transcript/credit counselling summary) for the 2020 Scholarship are due by **June 29th, 2023.** 

#### Judging

Winners of the scholarships will be determined by a panel of judges based on a 500-word essay and top 6 grade 12 marks.

(Marks 40%, Essay Score 30%, Extracurricular 30%)

Presentation of awards will occur by the middle of November to the OECTA Hamilton Secondary Unit member parents of the successful student applicants.

School and/or program confirmation must be received by the H.S.U. scholarship committee before any financial awards are dispersed.
